Coach Mark Voitach with the help of some fellow coaches and a local sports writer, put together this list of some of the best players of the Southern Tier Athletic Conference (STAC).

From The 1960s

Tom Gomulka- Johnson City's first STAC scoring champion and JC won first ever STAC title

Tim Anderson- , Susquehanna Valley HS...at the time of his graduation, he was the all time Broome County scoring leader and Binghamton Press All STAC.....

Al Dufty- Vestal HS...Coach Mickey Greenberg says Al was easily Vestal's best ever

Joe Kendrick- Chenango Valley HS...First great "one on one" player in STAC...Binghamton Press All STAC

Jim Donovan- Endicott- Seton HS...part of Coach Charlie Tarricone's first title team that upset a loaded Vestal team...All STAC and leader of the killer Ds (Donovan, Direnzo, Deluca, Dzuba)

Dick Barvinchak- Chenango Valley HS...Press All STAC, and held a passing record in STAC football....

Dave Tita- Binghamton Central HS...one of the few dominant big men in STAC at 6'10"...scored 41 in sectional final vs. Elmira Free Academy

Bill Gregory- Maine-Endwell HS, the "baby bull" at 6'7" was an inside presence Coach Dick Foley says one of the very best players he ever coached...
All STAC...

Dennis Breckner- Maine-Endwell HS...a house of a player, who could be unstoppable on the blocks and could step out for a midrange jumper..

Early 1970s

Ted Hull and Jim Waitkavicz - Susquehanna Valley HS...were the Sabers Batman and Robin....Hull the finesse guy, and. Waitavicz the hammer...led SV to a STAC title and a first ever intersectional win....both were two-time Press All STAC

Dave Wood- Vestal HS...at the time, Coach Will Lobb called him Vestal's best guard ever

Kent Pollak-, Binghamton Central HS .. member of Section 4 Hall of Fame and a rare 3 time Press All STAC pick....power of a big man.. with finesse of smaller players...
Steve Bradley- Maine-Endwell...5th year senior who was a great leader

Keith Carrington- Ithaca HS, two-time Press All STAC, and dominant player in the area his final year...

Late 70s

Rob Garbade, Susquehanna Valley HS , a big force for resurgent SV teams of late 70s....2 time Press All STAC.....

Rob Clune, Oneonta HS.....extremely versatile player, formed a great one two punch with now ESPN analyst Mark May....

Anderson Mitchell, Ithaca HS a solid scorer and a defensive standout.....

Tom Consol- Union-Endicott UE..versatile big man and key guy of Coach Tarricone's. Dynasty's early years...2 Time Press All STAC

Early 80s

Josh Green- Binghamton HS...one of the best pure shooters ever in STAC, and 2 time Press ALL STAC

Rick Coleman- Binghamton HS ...STAC s best athlete of his era...,

Rob Middlebrooks, Binghamton HS...stud inside and AN outside threat...very tough matchup

King Rice- Binghamton hs ... Only 4 time All Metro pick ever, and most say hands down best player ever out of this area....

Steve Downey-, Oneonta HS,..6'10' powerhouse for Yellowjackets

Bob Salankiewicz, Binghamton Seton Catholic Central HS...outstanding shooter

Sonny Spera, Union-Endicott HS...consummate point guard with bonus of 6'6" height, went on to play at Syracuse

Mike Sinicki, Union-Endicott HS..UEs only 1 ,000 point scorer and a D1 recruit, went on to play at Boston College

Sean Kerins, Union-Endicott HS...fundamentally sound big man, who went on to play at Syracuse.....

1990s

Ralph Bucci- Binghamton Seton Catholic Central HS fundamentally perfect...2 time All Metro...near impossible matchup...went on to play at St. Rose

Jay Danzi, Vestal HS....scoring machine and 2 time All Metro.

Eric Moschak, Johnson City...2 time All Metro STAC's leading scorer one year, became JC s all time assist leader the next

Mike Zarzycki, Johnson City HS..

Charlie Wightman, Norwich HS ..2 time All Metro...holds numerous STAC and state 3 point records.

Bob Lazor, Norwich HS , 6'8" stud who could also shoot 3s

Charles Gelatt, Chenango Valley HS...force on the blocks... 3 time All Metro and a 2000 plus point career scorer

2000s

Curtis Allen, Chenango Valley HS...dominant force of his era...led CV to first STAC title ever

Brad Conklin, Binghamton Seton Catholic Central HS ..lost life in tragic accident....can only imagine what he might have done with full career.....
